


Projected Global Hindu Population, 2010-2050











CHALLENGES— INDIAN SUBCONTINENT


- Demographic collapse

- Erosion of economic opportunities resulting in socio-political discord.




SOLUTIONS

- Building a global economic and social network that arrests crucial areas of social economic collapse of Hindu populations







% of adults who say religion is...




